| Introductions | <p>Donald Macphail asked everyone in attendance to introduce themselves and also asked if there was a volunteer to chair the meeting in the absence of Cllr Robert Marshall.</p> <p>Councillor Mike Hampson agreed to chair the meeting</p> | |
| Minutes of Last Meeting | The minutes of the last meeting were agreed and would be uploaded onto the web site | |
| Adoption of Terms of Reference | <p>A slide of the Terms of Reference with comments that had been received was shown to the group.</p> <p>A question was raised about not inviting the press. It was agreed that when the minutes are published on the web this is when they become public</p> <p>Councillor Hartshorn asked to have Shareshill included in the parish list</p> | HH |

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| <p>Appointment of Community Representatives</p> | <p>Councillor Bevan raised the question of why a community representative elected by the Parish Council had not been invited. Hilary said she had not received a letter but she would check.</p> | <p>HH</p> |
| <p>Construction Programme</p> | <p>Raz from VES Construction Contractors Clugston spoke at length about the site construction. He described the site layout using a site plan. Clugstons if possible, intended to lease part of a building next to the site as office space and also the yard next door as a storage yard</p> <p>Site works commenced, temporary site road surfacing and wheel cleaning facilities installed and site cabins etc were being delivered</p> <p>Soil movements had commenced following completion of approved ecological activities. Soil movements designed to minimise disruption. Excess soil/spoil not required on site landscaping being taken to Candles Landfill site to be used for site restoration work</p> <p>It will take 13 months to excavate and construct the bunker.</p> <p>Piling will start around 12th July and it is anticipated that this will take 9 weeks</p> <p>Raz said he will be attending the Liaison meeting regularly and he was happy to meet group members outside of this forum</p> <p>Lorry Routing signage would be erected shortly in liaison with the LPA/HA</p> <p>Clugston have a strong regard for the environment an key construction staff are being given special environmental awareness training in relation to specific site considerations.</p> <p>Councillor Downes raised concerns about traffic during construction.</p> <p>The site would be open 7am – 7pm Mon-Fri and until 1pm on Saturdays but would try to minimise traffic movements on Saturdays. The question was also raised about peak times in the morning and afternoon. Rash said that wherever possible deliveries etc would be planned to avoid peak times.</p> <p>Councillor Veronica Downes raised her concerns about congestion on Enterprise Drive and vehicles parking on Enterprise Drive. Ian Benson told the meeting that a Traffic Restriction Order – i.e. yellow lining had been agreed, after consultation, and these should be installed on the full length of Enterprise Drive in July-August 2011. This should alleviate trucks etc. parking on Enterprise Drive</p> | |

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| | <p>spend £50,000 on restoration work to Straight Mile. Ian Benson explained that already more than £50,000 had been spend and the £50,000 was for traffic calming measures.</p> <p>Councillor Hartshorn asked if there are any additional funds for practical remedial work to the road in Calf Heath. He suggested a 7.5 tonne exclusion zone and repairs to the road including painting a white line down each side of the road. Is this something that VES could look at? Donald Macphail said that it was possibly something that could be looked at along with SCC. Ian Benson told the meeting that Veolia had no obligations in this respect and had not been asked for a contribution. Ian also stated that SCC was doing work to get traffic data.</p> <p>Donald Macphail told the meeting about the Veolia Trust which was a source of funding for community based initiatives based on landfill tax contributions and he encouraged people to contact the trust for more information. Donald also suggested that the Trust be invited to a future meeting.</p> <p>A copy of the Traffic exclusion route map was passed around. The group were asked to report vehicles that were thought to be contravening the restriction route to make a note of the time, vehicle registration number and the location and send the information to VES where it will be followed up. The routing has been made clear to all VES drivers and its contractors.</p> <p>Steve Moseley asked about best ways of letting people know about the site. Suggestions were to let Parish clerk know so that any information could be reported at the Parish Meetings, to put an article in the local newsletters and also to get news put on the local parish web sites.</p> <p>Helen Price asked now that site construction had begun would this create a vermin problem. Raz said that little if any would be caused but there would be Pest Control contractors called to site if necessary.</p> |
